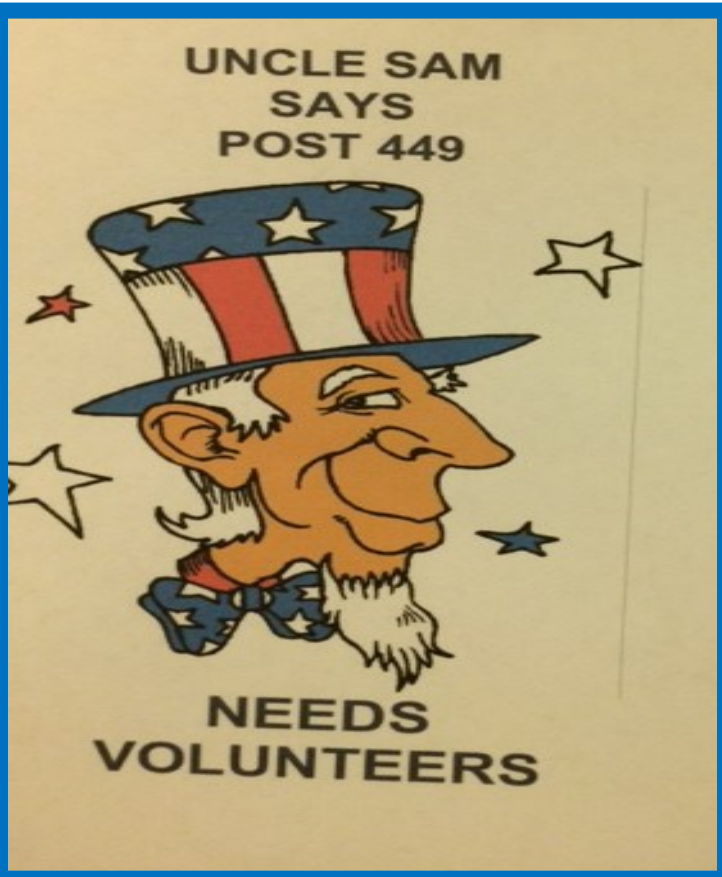

VA NEWS & INFORMATION:

The Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) recently added rare cancers to the presumptive disability list, marking a significant advancement for our veterans. This important addition stands to benefit a specific group of veterans who have faced the challenges posed by these conditions.

Veterans are often surprised to discover that they can still access valuable VA benefits even with a 0% disability rating. This information may be one of the VA's best-kept secrets, as it is not widely discussed within the veteran community. Moreover, many Veteran Service Organizations (VSOs) seldom mention this possibility, leaving veterans unaware of the potential resources available to them. Understanding these benefits is crucial, as it empowers veterans to fully leverage the support they have earned through their service.

Did you know Perfluoroalkyl and Polyfluoroalkyl Substances (PFAS) are a group of chemicals with significant persistence in the environment and serious disease-causing effects for humans? In fact, PFAS withstand degradation to such an extent that they are also known as forever chemicals and can only be removed from the water and soil through specific and costly methods. In the U.S. PFAS have been used since the 1950s, with more stringent legislation for safe disposal and production adopted only recently in light of decades of evidence that links these chemicals with serious health effects.

Did you know the National Cemeteries Preservation and Protection Act of 2022 allowed the VA to establish sections of graveyards in National Cemeteries for "green burials?" For a burial to be considered "green" by the VA, the body may be cremated or buried, but preparations must be free of chemicals or embalming fluids and the urn or casket must be biodegradable or securely wrapped in a biodegradable shroud. The National

Cemetery Administration has always accepted naturally prepared remains or those in biodegradable containers for burial in national cemeteries, but a new pilot program will let veterans and their families select a final resting place tailored for their wishes.

Did you know the VA is launching a new outreach campaign to encourage all eligible veterans to enroll in VA health care? This campaign will include text messages and emails directly to veterans, public service announcements, paid advertising, and events. VA is launching this campaign after reports of concerns from veterans about health issues. Veterans are concerned about mental health challenges and thoughts of suicide potentially related to repeated blasts and head trauma (low-level artillery blasts, IEDs, missile launches, heavy fire, and more). Since the first reporting about these concerns, VA researchers have been urgently studying this matter to learn more about the potential health impacts of blast exposure on veterans.

Did you know the Dependency Indemnity Compensation (DIC) provided by the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) is a crucial benefit for the spouses, children, and sometimes parents of veterans who have passed away? This benefit aims to provide financial support to families who face significant challenges after losing their loved one. DIC is a tax-free monthly benefit that can greatly ease the burden of financial instability during a difficult period.

Did you know the VA recently announced an overhaul of its family caregiver program that expands eligibility for some veterans but also institutes new eligibility requirements that will affect the thousands of veterans already enrolled? VA will expand access to include as many as 3,000 veterans who currently don't meet the eligibility criteria but the VA considers unemployable. Caregivers will benefit from increased financial support, allowing them to dedicate more time and resources to caring for veterans. Additionally, the expansion of eligibility criteria means that more families can access the support they need, ensuring that no veteran is left behind.

A new report released from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services highlights the dangers faced by so many on military installations and for decades aboard U.S. military war crafts. It now officially lists

Trichloroethylene, or TCE, as a human carcinogen. TCE is a primary pollutant at installations such as Camp Lejeune and other military Superfund Sites, and is known to be a primary driver for exposure-related acute leukemia.

The Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) has announced a significant reduction in insurance rates, which will take effect in Spring 2025, marking a pivotal moment for veterans. This change not only lowers costs but also expands eligibility for many veterans, empowering them to access essential coverage that supports their health and well-being. By ensuring that more veterans can benefit from these

important resources, the VA aligns with its mission to provide comprehensive support to those who have served our country.

Jungle rot, also known as tropical ulcer or tinea pedis, can have significant detrimental effects on veterans who experience it, particularly veterans who may have encountered it during service. In the short term, symptoms often include painful skin lesions, itching, and inflammation, which can lead to discomfort and hinder daily activities. If left untreated, these infections can progress and result in complications such as secondary bacterial infections or even systemic infections, which may require hospitalization. Long-term effects can include chronic skin issues, scarring, and potential psychological impacts such as anxiety or depression related to ongoing health concerns. Awareness and education about jungle rot are crucial for veterans, as understanding these effects can lead to timely intervention and improved health outcomes. According to recent studies, approximately 10-15% of veterans who served in tropical environments report experiencing some form of jungle rot, highlighting the need for comprehensive resources and support to address this health issue.

Did you know the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) is taking steps to improve transparency and access to health care for veterans through the newly proposed Complete the Mission Act? This new legislation requires the VA to disclose appointment delays, explain cancellations, and provide veterans with options for care, whether within the VA system or through private-sector providers.

Chronic Pain Syndrome (CPS) is a complex and often debilitating condition characterized by persistent pain that lasts longer than the typical healing process, usually exceeding three to six months. This pain can arise from various causes, including injuries, surgeries, or underlying health conditions. For veterans, the impact of CPS can be particularly profound, affecting not only their physical health but also their emotional well-being and quality of life.

There have been many interesting questions coming to my desk recently from our local bank, the State of Wisconsin, and our members, which leads me to believe that there are many more individuals with the same type of questions. Hopefully this will answer many of these questions per Sara T. Riegel, Executive Director, American Legion Auxiliary National Headquarters [Compliance@ALforVeterans.org](mailto:Compliance@ALforVeterans.org). "This letter confirms that the American Legion Auxiliary Cudworth-Stenz-Griesell-Smith Unit 449 WI is a chartered organization of the American Legion National Organizations, with the headquarters located in Indianapolis, Indiana.

I have confirmed that the American Legion Auxiliary Cudworth-Stenz-Griesell-Smith Unit 449 is in good standing, has met the requirements at the time of this writing for inclusion under the American Legion Auxiliary National Group Exemption Ruling roster (GEN0964) and is recognized as a 501(c)(19) Veterans'

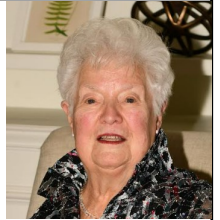
Organization for the purpose of federal tax-exemption with the ability granted to receive tax-deductible donations per Internal Revenue Code 170(c)(3)."

Questions have been asked about whether we run the organization from the dues we collect or by holding fund raising events. The Unit keeps \$2.00 from the \$36.00 collected from each member. The rest of it goes to the Department of Wisconsin and the National Organization for their portion of the dues.

Additional funding that we donate to the Veterans Programs comes from the fund raising events that we hold and from the donations that we receive from various other organizations and individuals. Donations made to our organization are tax deductible for the donors and we are happy to provide letters to the donors as proof of their donations for tax purposes. Our Unit dues and fund raisers are divided into three funds which are General, VA&R and PPP. The General Fund is made up of our \$2.00 dues & 29% of funds raised, 58-78% of funds raised go into VA&R and can be used to benefit veterans only; PPP is the Past Presidents group which raises funds independently to benefit scholarships, Badger Girls State and other PPP goals. The General Funds cover all organizational costs including County and District dues, our Unit rent for Post 449, our share of the cost of members receiving the 449er, Scholarships and additional projects that encompass veteran's families and events. For God and Country, our mission and goal is to recognize and serve veterans from the past and those who are currently serving our nation. It is our desire to continue in this vein in the future. At this time we are working at catching up on our VA&R projects. We have fallen very far behind in the last six months.

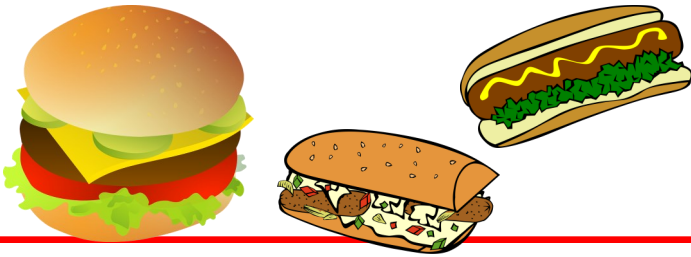
