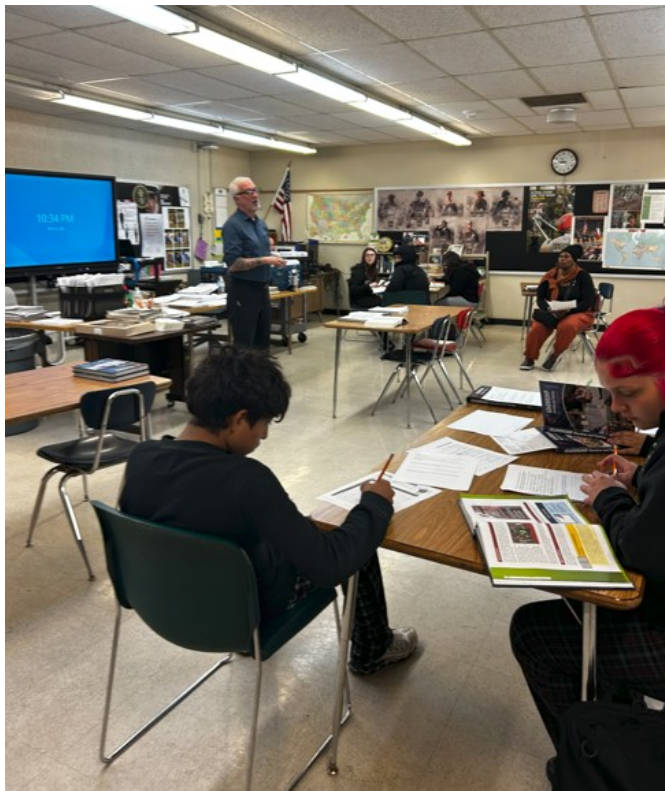

VA NEWS & INFORMATION:

Did you know hip pain is a common source of VA disability compensation because military service often involves heavy physical strain, repetitive impact, and injuries that can damage the hips over time? Depending on the underlying condition, symptom severity, and loss of function, the VA may assign ratings ranging from 10% to 90%. If both hips are service-connected, the VA may also apply the bilateral factor to increase the combined rating.

Did you know under a new rule, the VA will pay a surviving spouse or child claimant whichever benefit is higher either the DIC or the Survivors Pension? VA reported the higher benefit is usually the DIC and claimants will be paid without delaying payment to fully process the lesser benefit as it was in the past. The VA identified one exception: if the claimant is the veteran's surviving spouse, has no dependents, is residing in a nursing home, and has applied for or is receiving Medicaid, then the Survivors' Pension will be awarded instead of DIC.

Arthritis may be considered service-connected if there is evidence showing it began during military service, was

caused by an in-service injury or event, or was aggravated by service duties over time. This can include direct injuries to joints, repetitive strain from physical tasks, or secondary connections where arthritis develops as a result of another service-connected condition (such as joint instability or prior fractures).

Did you know untreated sleep apnea can lead to hypertension, as repeated oxygen deprivation during sleep triggers the body's stress response and raises blood pressure? In the opposite direction, hypertension may contribute to the development or worsening of sleep apnea by affecting the upper airway or causing fluid retention that can obstruct the airway during sleep. Combining these two conditions can help you get an increase in compensation

Did you know Inclusion Body Myositis (IBM) is a rare, progressive muscle disorder? It's part of a group of inflammatory muscle diseases, but it behaves differently from most of them. IBM shows up in veteran populations in some important ways: 1. Because IBM mainly affects people over 50, and it's more commonly diagnosed among aging veteran populations, especially those from earlier service eras; 2. IBM can significantly affect daily life; 3. IBM is a slow but disabling muscle disease that disproportionately affects older veterans.

Did you know that military spouses are eligible to receive up to \$4,000 of financial assistance to pursue degrees, licenses, or credentials? Managed by the Department of Defense (DoD), MyCAA offers up to \$4,000 in financial assistance for military spouses to pursue education and training in a portable career field.

In January 2020, President Joe Biden signed the VIP Act into law as part of the National Defense Authorization Act. Notably, the National Parks Service (NPS) actually declared that veterans and Gold Star families will have free access to the parks. The difference here is that this law includes lifetime passes for people who are on active duty. The law gives free access to both the veteran and those traveling with them in a single vehicle.

To qualify for free access under the new law, veterans must have served in any of the U.S. Armed Forces (including the Reserves and the National Guard). Veterans can prove this by providing one of a number of IDs upon entrance to a park, including a Veteran ID Card, veterans designation on a driver's license or another form of state ID, a veteran health

identification card, and so on. Gold Star families can print out a voucher.

Many veterans walk into a C&P exam thinking it's just a routine appointment, but small missteps in that room can significantly impact their claim. Common mistakes include downplaying symptoms out of pride, failing to be consistent with prior medical records, skipping important details about how conditions affect daily life, or trying to "tough it out" during the evaluation. Others may guess at answers, exaggerate inconsistently, or overlook the importance of describing flare-ups and worst-day scenarios. What many don't realize is that every word, hesitation, and inconsistency sends a signal to the examiner about credibility and severity. In this video, you'll learn how to avoid these pitfalls, communicate your condition clearly and honestly, and understand what your responses may be telling the examiner.

A new report released from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services highlights the dangers faced by so many on military installations and for decades aboard U.S. military war crafts. It now officially lists Trichloroethylene, or TCE, as a human carcinogen. TCE is a primary pollutant at installations such as Camp Lejeune and other military Superfund Sites, and is known to be a primary driver for exposure-related acute leukemia

Did you know the VA has a "duty to assist" veterans in helping them obtain their medical records to support their VA disability claim? At the same time, it is the veteran's responsibility to provide any and all evidence that they wish to submit to the VA to help support their claim. Very important for the veterans to take charge, especially when most veterans allege the VA puts in very little help in retrieving medical records for veterans.

Did you know VA rates shoulder and arm disabilities based on diagnosis, severity, range of motion loss, and dominance of the affected arm?

Did you know veterans receiving VA disability compensation could see an estimated 3.5% - 4% increase in monthly disability benefits in 2027 if inflation trends continue? While the official Cost-of-Living Adjustment (COLA) has not yet been announced, early projections suggest veterans may receive a larger monthly payment to help offset rising costs for housing, food, healthcare, and everyday expenses. The final increase will be determined by inflation data later this year and announced by

the Social Security Administration in October 2026, with updated VA payments expected to begin in early 2027.

Don't miss out on what we're building together.

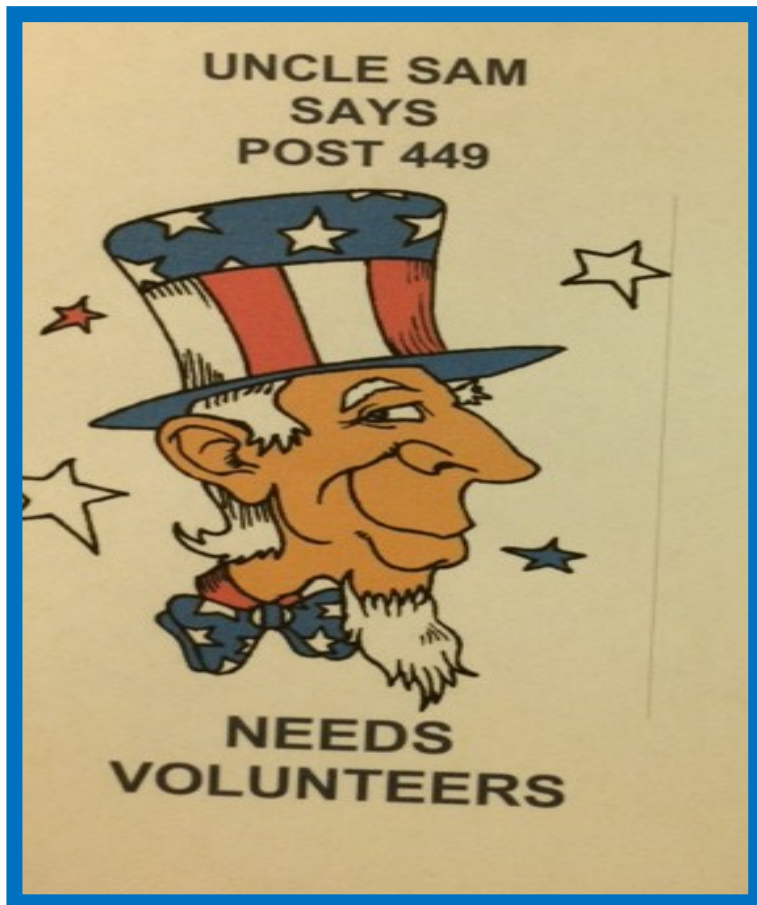
Post 449 Chaplain Message

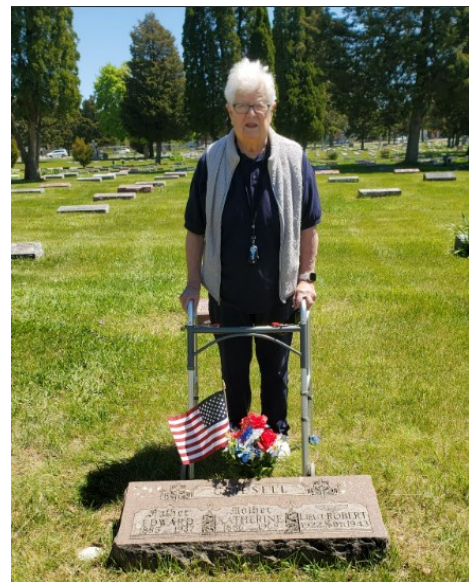
