VA NEWS & INFORMATION:

Did you know the VA is required to notify a veteran of

the information that is needed in order to obtain the benefits requested? This is called the VA's duty to notify. Also, the VA is required to obtain information, and evidence that would support a veteran's claim such as service records, service medical records, etc. This is also called the VA's duty to assist. The purpose of these duties is to make it easier on the veteran claiming benefits to gather all of the necessary evidence for a successful claim.

Did you know PFAS, often referred to as "forever chemicals," present unique challenges for Air Force veterans? PFAS can lead to serious health implications and long-term effects, including increased risks of certain cancers, liver damage, and immune system dysfunction. It is crucial for Air Force veterans to be aware of these risks and to seek accurate information regarding their health and potential compensation options.

Symptoms of CAD may include chest pain (angina), shortness of breath, fatigue, and in severe cases, heart attacks. Recognizing these symptoms early can make a significant difference in managing the condition and

improving overall health. The VA recognizes the significant impact of CAD on veterans' health and offers disability ratings to provide necessary compensation. Agent Orange, a herbicide used during the Vietnam War, has been linked to numerous health issues, including CAD and other heart conditions. Veterans exposed to Agent Orange are at higher risk for developing them, and, again, the VA recognizes this connection by offering presumptive service connection for ischemic heart disease, which includes CAD

Did you know veterans who have suffered debilitating illnesses after exposure to jet fuel, solvents and other environmental hazards while serving at Karshi-Khanabad Air Base in Uzbekistan after September 11, 2001, will be able to receive disability benefits? The Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) recently made the announcement.

The Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) offers a range of benefits not only to veterans but also to their surviving spouses, children and dependents. These benefits serve as a lifeline, providing crucial support and assistance to those left behind. Here are six significant VA benefits that pass on to survivors:

1. Dependency and Indemnity Compensation (DIC):
DIC is a tax-free monthly benefit paid to eligible survivors of service members who died in the line of duty or veterans whose death resulted from a service-related injury or illness. This compensation helps offset the financial burden experienced by surviving spouses, children, and dependent parents.

2. Survivors Pension (Death Pension):
The Survivors Pension provides financial support to low-income, un-remarried surviving spouses and unmarried children of deceased wartime veterans. Eligibility criteria include financial need, the deceased veteran's wartime service, and the survivor's income and net worth.

3. Education Benefits (GI Bill Transfer):
Through the Transfer of Entitlement (TOE) option, eligible veterans can transfer all or a portion of their unused Post-9/11 GI Bill benefits to their spouse or dependent children. This benefit covers tuition, fees, housing, and other educational expenses, empowering survivors to pursue their academic goals

4. Home Loan Guaranty Program:
Surviving spouses of veterans may be eligible for VA home loan benefits, including the VA Home Loan Guaranty program. This program provides loans with favorable

terms, such as no down payment and competitive interest rates, making homeownership more accessible for eligible survivors.

5. Healthcare Benefits:

Certain surviving spouses and dependents of deceased veterans may qualify for VA health care benefits through programs like CHAMPVA (Civilian Health and Medical Program of the Department of Veterans Affairs). CHAMPVA covers a portion of medical expenses not covered by other insurance plans, offering vital health care support.

Did you know more than 300,000 veterans have died from Agent Orange exposure? Which is almost five times as many as the 58,000 who died in combat during the Vietnam conflict.

Did you know veterans or active duty service members with a VA-guaranteed home loan who are facing foreclosure, may use the Veterans Affairs Servicing Purchase (VASP) program, which may help keep them in their home? Call today if your servicer agency is proceeding with foreclosure without exploring other temporary options. You can call 877-827-3702 and select 4 (TTY: 711). Open Monday through Friday, 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. EST.

Veterans face unique challenges when it comes to scars—whether from the rigors of combat, the demanding nature of military training, or the spirited competition of military sports. The U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) offers specific benefits for these scars, recognizing their impact on a veteran's quality of life. Veterans may be eligible for compensation for scars obtained during active duty, which can include financial support and access to medical services. It's important for veterans to understand these entitlements and actively advocate for themselves to ensure they receive the benefits they deserve.

Did you know that migraine headaches significantly impact the lives of many veterans, creating an additional layer of challenge on top of their already unique struggles? It's crucial to raise awareness about this issue within the veteran community, as understanding and support can greatly enhance well-being

Did you know as of last September 2023 there were an estimated 17.9 million veterans living in the United States? And, there were 5.27 million veterans with a service-connected disability. But, only 6% of veterans receive VA benefits.

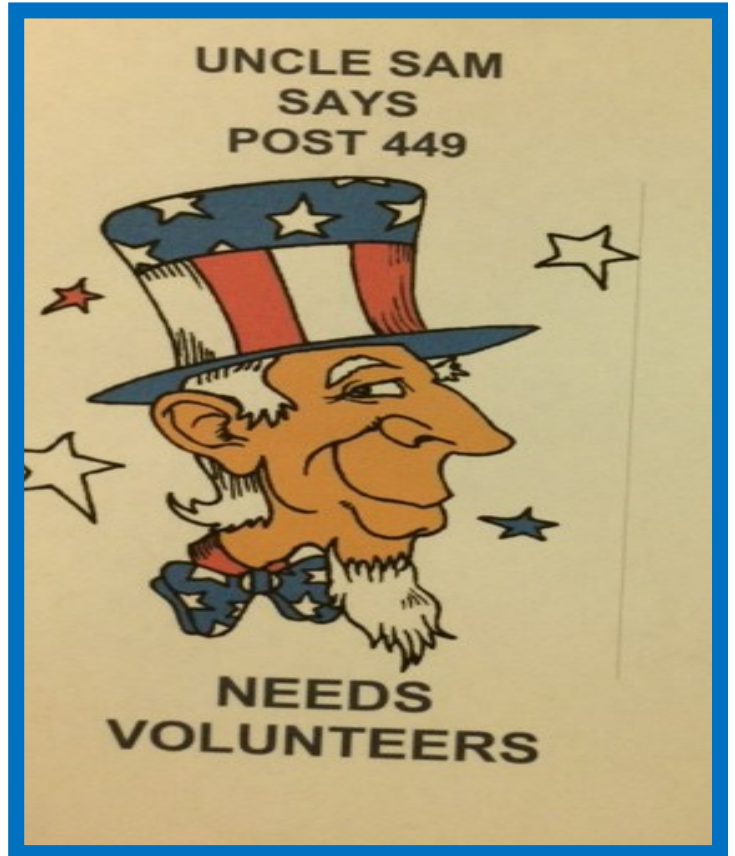

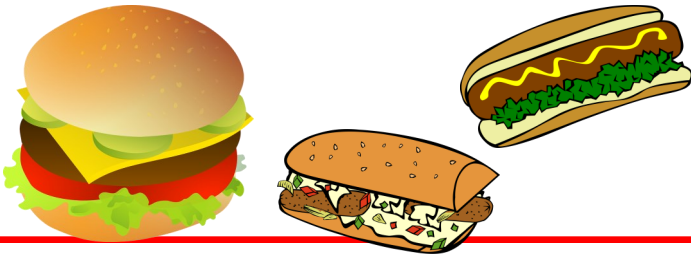
